In accordance with the authority vested in the Chief Judge by Rule 2.050 of the Florida Rules of Judicial Administration, and Section 43.28, Florida Statutes, which provides that : "The counties shall provide...personnel necessary to operate the circuit and county courts", the Court finds that an internal auditor for the probate division is such necessary personnel. It is therefore,

ORDERED that:

1. In an effort to maximize the use of the existing personnel, facilities, and equipment of the circuit court, the Clerk of the Courts Internal Audit Division will be utilized to assist the Probate Division in monitoring the compliance with Florida Rules of Probate and Guardianship Procedure in guardianship matters.
2. The internal auditor shall be authorized to conduct audits and examinations of the inventories and accountings filed with the Clerk of the Court pursuant to the laws and rules that govern guardianship matters.
3. In conducting the audits and examinations, the auditor shall be authorized to request production of records and substantiating documentation of the inventories and accountings in order to monitor the financial transactions of guardians which the Probate Division has been vested with the authority to supervise.
4. The audits will be at the request of the Probate Division and not the Clerk of the Court.
