EXTENSION OF INJUNCTIONS
FOR PROTECTION
AGAINST VIOLENCE DUE TO
HURRICANE WARNING

In accordance with the authority vested in the Chief Judge pursuant to Rule 2.050 of the Florida Rules of Judicial Administration, and

WHEREAS a Hurricane Warning issued for Broward County as a result of the ensuing threat of a hurricane results in the closing of the Broward County Courthouse, and

WHEREAS injunctions for protection against domestic, repeat, dating or sexual violence issued by this circuit may be set for hearing and due to expire during this state of emergency, and

WHEREAS to ensure the continued safety and protection of injunction petitioners against domestic, repeat, dating or sexual violence,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. All injunctions for protection against domestic, repeat, dating or sexual violence set for hearing and/or due to expire during the hurricane warning or state of emergency associated with a hurricane or state of emergency declared for Broward County are hereby extended until further order of the court.

2. This order rescinds and replaces Administrative Order I-05-T-1.
