In accordance with the authority vested in the Chief Judge by Rule 2.050 of the Florida Rules of Judicial Administration, it is

ORDERED that:

Effective January, 2001, GJ Judge will preside over both the Juvenile Detention and Shelter Hearings, Monday through Friday at 1:30 P.M. in Room 241.

1. When GJ Judge is unavailable to conduct detention and shelter hearings (outside the Courthouse building) due to illness, personal emergency, vacation, etc., then a Relief Judge must cover the detention and shelter hearings for that day or week, even if that means rescheduling or continuing their own hearings. If for some reason the Relief Judge can not cover the relief assignment, then the Relief Judge is responsible to make arrangements for another Judge to cover his/her relief assignment.

2. The Relief responsibilities belong to the "Division" not the individual judge. Should one of the assigned Relief Judges change divisions, then the judge who assumes his/her division will assume the relief assignment as well.

3. This Administrative Order does not conflict with Administrative Order I-99-B-1A, regarding Official Court Holidays or Administrative Order No. I-99-I-1 regarding Circuit/County Court Conference Coverage schedules. For Example, during holidays (Christmas, etc.) detention/shelter hearings will be handled by the Magistrate Judge.
