**ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER VACATING CIVIL ADMINISTRATIVE
ORDERS**

(a) Florida Rule of Judicial Administration 2.215 (b) (3) states that the chief judge “shall, considering available resources, ensure the efficient and proper administration of all counts within [this] circuit.”

(b) Florida Rule of Judicial Administration 2.215 (e) (3) requires the Chief Judge to perform an annual review of all local administrative orders to ensure that none conflict with supreme court or local rules.

(c) A review of the Civil Administrative Orders reveals a need to vacate certain orders that are in conflict with statutes, supreme court rules, or no longer required for judicial proceedings.

(d) In accordance with the authority vested in the Chief Judge by Florida Rule of Judicial Administration 2.215, it is hereby **ORDERED**:

(1) Civil Administrative Orders 2009-107-Civ, 2011-17-Civ, 2011-18-Civ, 2011-33-Civ, 2012-2-Civ, 2016-21-Civ, and 2016-47-Civ are **VACATED**.
