Teen Court Proceedings

The Teen Court Program is designed to be a positive experience for everyone. As a volunteer, your child will have an opportunity to be a role model for other teens. The program uses positive peer pressure as a means of teaching others to learn from their poor choices. Sentencing hearings are held in an actual courtroom at one of the Broward County Courthouses. The process is structured, educational, and although serious, should be enjoyable for all participants. This also means that there is an expected amount of responsibility. You, as a parent, are expected to review the rules with your child and ensure that they understand these rules. Failure to comply with any of the Teen Court Rules could result in dismissal from the program.

Transportation and Emergency Contact Number(s)

Please review the phone numbers you have listed on page 1 of this application. Your child needs to know how and where to contact you (or another responsible adult) if the need arises. If court ends early, your child will be instructed to call you for an early pickup. In all cases, you are expected to have transportation arranged IN ADVANCE and AVAILABLE BY 6:30 PM. Please be aware that Teen Court staff members cannot provide extended supervision for any students who are not picked up in a timely fashion after court proceedings are finished.

Teen Court Dress Code

NEAT AND CONSERVATIVE DRESS IS A REQUIREMENT

All pants must be worn at the waist. No holes in pants of any kind. No shorts of any length. No sports jerseys or concert T-shirts. No inappropriate lettering or illustrations on T-shirts. No sleeveless shirts, tank tops, or muscle shirts. No midriff shirts. No mini-skirts. No sunglasses. No sandals, or flip-flops. No headgear, such as hats, caps, bandanas, doo rags, etc.

Personal presentation will be strictly enforced for all participants in the Teen Court Program. Your child will be dismissed if he/she is not in compliance with the dress code and no credit will be given for their attendance.

Teen Court Rules of Conduct

- Arrive by 4:30 PM. All participants must be on time in order to participate. Allow extra time for security screening.
- It is mandatory to be picked up or have a method of transportation available by 6:30 PM. Courthouse security
 does not allow access to the building once the proceedings have ended. Typically, staff members prefer not to
 leave anyone unattended while waiting for a ride. Supervision is not provided after 7:00 PM unless court
 proceedings run late. If punctual transportation should become a problem, your child will not be allowed to
 participate in Teen Court.
- Strict adherence to the Teen Court Dress Code is required.
- No gum, food, or drink is allowed in the courtroom.
- Cell phones must be turned OFF while in the courtroom and cannot be used without permission. No technological devices are allowed in the courtroom, such as iPods, MP3 players, hand-held games, etc.
- No tobacco products or any illegal objects are allowed. Keep in mind that you are in a courthouse and will need to pass through a security checkpoint upon entering. Weapons, mace, or pepper spray are never allowed. Nail clippers, scissors, chains, any spiked or sharp objects may be confiscated by courthouse security
- Maintain the Oath of Confidentiality. Other than during the deliberation process for a particular case, you should not disclose, discuss, or compare any information you hear while participating in Teen Court.
- You must behave in a professional manner at all times. Laughing or talking while court is in session is not tolerated. Remember, the cases are real people and real families who must abide by your decision. The verdict you render is legal and binding by the Florida Judicial Circuit, therefore, it is important that you act appropriately and take this responsibility very seriously.
- Be free of bias or prejudice towards any person's age, race, sex, religion, national origin, or disability. Your job is to render a verdict that will help the defendant learn from his or her choices and not merely be punitive.
- Follow all directions given by the Teen Court Staff. Be sure to contact a staff member if you have any questions, concerns, or are uncertain about something.
