**With a MyACCESS account you can:** apply for benefits, check the status of an application, report changes, receive information faster by opting-in to receive electronic notifications, and upload documents 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. **Florida KidCare** includes free, subsidized, and full-pay options for health and dental insurance for Florida children ages 0-18.
