ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER REQUIRING ESTABLISHMENT SUPPORT DEPOSITORY ACCOUNT

- (a) Florida Rule of Judicial Administration 2.215(b)(3) states the chief judge shall "develop an administrative plan for the efficient and proper administration of all courts within that circuit."
- (b) The volume of unified family cases that include a final judgment or order for support requires a uniform procedure to establish a depositoiry account for the receipt, disbursement, and enforcement of support obligations.
- (c) In accordance with the authority vested in the chief judge by Florida Rule of Judicial Administration 2.215, it is ordered:
- (1) The attorney of record for a party receiving support shall establish a depository account with the Clerk of the Circuit Court within ten (10) days of the final judgment or order establishing a support obligation. If the party entitled to receive support does not have an attorney then the party shall establish a depository account with the Clerk of the Circuit Court within ten (10) days of the final judgment or order establishing a support obligation.
- (2) At the time of establishing the depository account with the Clerk of Circuit Court the attorney and/or party shall complete any and all forms required by the Clerk of Circuit Court and provide a copy of the final judgment or order establishing the support obligation.
- (3) If a final judgment or order establishing a support obligation is modified, a copy of the modified order shall be provided to the Clerk of Circuit Court's depository staff within (10) days of the final judgment or order modifying the support obligation.
