ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER TRANSFERRING CASES FROM CIRCUIT CRIMINAL DIVISION FO TO CIRCUIT CRIMINAL DIVISION FX

(a) Pursuant to Article V, section 2(d) of the Florida Constitution and section 43.26, Florida Statutes, the chief judge of each judicial circuit is charged with the authority and power to do everything necessary to promote the prompt and efficient administration of justice.

(b) Florida Rule of Judicial Administration 2.215(b)(3) states that the chief judge shall "considering available resources, ensure the efficient and proper administration of all courts within [this] circuit."

(c) Florida Rule of Judicial Administration 2.215(b)(4) permits the chief judge to assign cases to judges for disposition, and upcoming judicial reassignments require the transfer of certain criminal division cases.

(d) In accordance with the authority vested in the chief judge by Article V, section 2(d) of the Florida Constitution, section 43.26, Florida Statutes, and Florida Rule of Judicial Administration 2.215, it is hereby **ORDERED**, <u>effective January 1, 2019</u>,

(1) The Clerk of Court shall transfer all active and pending cases currently assigned to Circuit Criminal Division FO to Circuit Criminal Division FX.
