CIVIL TRAFFIC INFRACTIONS TRANSFERRED TO A DIVISION

(a) Pursuant to Article V, section 2(d) of the Florida Constitution and section 43.26, Florida Statutes, the chief judge of each judicial circuit is charged with the authority and power to do everything necessary to promote the prompt and efficient administration of justice.

(b) Florida Rule of General Practice and Judicial Administration 2.215(b)(3) states the Chief Judge shall "develop an administrative plan" and "shall, considering available resources, ensure the efficient and proper administration of all courts within [this] circuit."

(c) In accordance with the authority vested in the Chief Judge by Article V, section 2(d) of the Florida Constitution, section 43.26, Florida Statutes, and Florida Rule of General Practice and Judicial Administration 2.215, it is hereby **ORDERED**:

(1) In any and all cases transferred from a Civil Traffic Infraction Hearing Officer to a Trial Court Division shall be set for non-jury trial within thirty (30) days of the transfer, unless a shorter period is necessary to avoid a dismissal, and there shall be no further pretrial conferences.
