## ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER DESIGNATING RECORD NEWSPAPER

(a) Pursuant to Article V, section 2(d) of the Florida Constitution and section 43.26, Florida Statutes, the chief judge of each judicial circuit is charged with the authority and power to do everything necessary to promote the prompt and efficient administration of justice.

(b) Florida Rule of General Practice & Judicial Administration 2.215(b)(3) states that the chief judge shall "considering available resources, ensure the efficient and proper administration of all courts within [this] circuit."

(c) Section 50.0711, Florida Statute, requires the designation of a record newspaper by a majority of judges in the circuit.

(d) The current designated newspaper of record, the Daily Business Review, is ceasing print operations

(d) In accordance with the authority vested in the chief judge by Article V, section 2(d) of the Florida Constitution, section 43.26, Florida Statutes, and Florida Rule of General Practice & Judicial Administration 2.215, it is hereby **ORDERED** 

(1) That by a majority of the judges in the circuit, the Sun Sentinel is designated as the record newspaper for those matters set forth in Section 50.0711 Florida Statute.

(2) The Administrative Order replaces and supersedes Administrative Order 2012-21-Gen.
